#### *From the desk of Carol Hinkle (HACC Director)*

Two thousand forty (2,040) Meals-On-Wheels, forty-two hundred fourteen (4,214) Clothing Bank, fourteen thousand four hundred forty-two (14,442) Provide-A-Lunch, seventeen hundred and one (1,701) Ruth's Harvest, Twenty-five hundred seventy-eight (2,578) Faith-at-Work, nineteen hundred thirteen (1,913) Changing Lives Shelter. What do these numbers mean? These are roughly the number of hours of service people have donated to the Hanover Area Council of Churches. This is by no means complete. We have records for 2015 accounting for an amazing 30,403 hours of service. This does not include Building Committee services, ministry coordinators who just do things and neglect to sign in and out, committee members who attend meetings and do various things to help within the ministries without thought to the time it involved. Why do I start with these statistics?

*I don't think Christ calls us to volunteer. He calls us to serve!*

April is Volunteer Appreciation Month and I want all of you to know how immeasurably valuable each person is in their service to our ministries and the individuals who seek our help. I want to say "thank you and God bless each and every person that gives of their time, talents, and treasure to our work here as the Lord's hands and feet in Hanover." We have a small staff and without the hundreds of people who help us in so many areas we could not serve the numbers of those in need that we do. We would also like to mention that we are a great place for school projects to be accomplished. Whether Graduation, National Honor Society Service, Confirmation or Scouting service projects

## SPOTLIGHT ON MINISTRY

*In a continuing feature for our newsletter we will highlight a ministry from a volunteers' experience. It is important to understand how those who do the work on a daily basis see Who We Are and What We Do!*

### Endowment Fund—A Way to Help the Hanover Area Council of Churches

Some of us during our lifetime accumulate assets. Personal property such as vehicles or jewelry, real estate, checking and savings accounts, investments such as stocks and bonds, IRAs and retirement accounts are some of the major assets we accumulate. As Christians we believe these assets are from God.

What happens to these assets at our death? As Christians we can use our estate to demonstrate our desire to fulfill the commandment to love God and our neighbor. If you act to create an estate plan or will you can decide where these assets go.

One very practical way to do this is to include the Hanover Area Council of Churches (HACC) in our will or estate plan so HACC can be a blessing to future generations. Drawing up an estate plan or will is a simple process, but make sure it is done correctly. An estate plan or will should be drawn up by a qualified attorney familiar with your financial circumstances,



family situation and wishes for your assets.

One simple vehicle is to leave a gift in your will. It can be as simple as: "I give, devise, and bequest to Hanover Area Council of Churches in Hanover, PA the sum of \_\_\_\_\_ dollars (\$\_\_\_\_) or other specifically described property for its general uses and purposes."

Or it could be "I give, devise, and bequest to Hanover Council of Churches in Hanover, PA an amount equal to \_\_\_\_ percent (\_\_\_\_%) of the value of my (gross or net) estate or some account; e.g. IRA, investment, savings/checking, etc."

There are numerous other estate planned giving vehicles that can benefit both the giver and HACC including Charitable Gift Annuities and charitable trusts. You can call the council office for more information on these.

## April Is Polio Awareness Month

**On April 22, 2015 the Pennsylvania House of Representatives passed a Unanimous Resolution**

Polio Awareness Month has a dual purpose.

- 1) Draw attention to the estimated 1.1 million Polio Survivors in the US, the majority of who are realizing the disabling effects of Post-Polio Syndrome.
- 2) Draw attention to the importance of being immunized against this crippling disease.

April 12, 2015 marked 60 years since Jonas Salk's polio vaccine was launched; which enabled children to be protected against polio for the first time. Within a few years, polio virtually disappeared. Polio was declared eradicated in the United States in 1979, yet is still present in some impoverished countries, mostly due to lack of vaccination. We celebrate the efforts of Rotary International's "End Polio Now" campaign, which is leading the effort to vaccinate children in every corner of the world.

We hope you will consider interviewing survivors, and sharing their inspirational stories of survival. In addition we hope you will help us communicate our network contact and website information to the survivors who are not aware that caring assistance is easily available.
