If this is true for you, then this year I'd like for you to try something. During Advent, when your feet first hit the floor in the morning (or, if it's better for you, just before you get into bed), spend just 60 seconds giving thanks; fill your heart, remembering all they ways that God has blessed you. Our hearts are a vital part of our bodies; without it there is no life. It infuses our whole body with life-giving blood and oxygen, so if our hearts are filled with a never ending, stressful list of things that need to be done (or other unnecessary worry), it will, most certainly, set the tone also for our bodies, minds and spirits. However, when our hearts are filled with our blessings, then our bodies, minds and spirits are also infused with love and hope and joy.

In Advent, traditionally we prepare to celebrate the gift of the Christ-child. So, it is a wonderful time to remember that the most important gifts are not the material things we will give or receive but, that the greatest gifts are found in God's blessings, given to us in so many ways, large and small, throughout the whole year.

I wish you a hope and joy-filled season! Let your hearts be filled with thanks.

Madre Liz, as she prefers to be called if you call all male priests "Father", has been ordained for 23 years. She attended The General Theological Seminary in New York City, graduating in 1994. Though she was sponsored by the Diocese of East Carolina, she went on to be the curate at Trinity Church in Buffalo, NY, where she served for two years, doing youth work, as well as other priestly duties.

She also served in parishes in Tucson (St. Philip's In The Hills), Phoenix (St. Stephen's), Oro Valley, AZ (Church of the Apostles), Boulder, CO (St. John's), Racine, WI (St. Luke's), Jamestown, NY (St. Luke's), Kodiak, AK (St. James the Fisherman), and Fairbanks, AK (St. Matthew's).

As an Army brat, Liz was born in Tokyo, Japan, and lived with her family in Germany, Virginia, Colorado, and North Carolina, where her family settled because they fell in love with their church, St. Paul's-in-the-Pines. This would be the parish that sponsored Liz for ordination 20 years later. But before that, Liz graduated from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill with a bachelor's degree in journalism and worked as a reporter for four years, followed by work at The Episcopal Home for the Aging, now known as Penick Village, as an activity assistant and social worker. Finally, before attending seminary, and just to make sure she was truly being called to the priesthood, she worked for four years as a counselor in addictions treatment centers.

When she is not taking her three dogs to the dog park, Liz enjoys watching baseball and football, attending the sports of her church kids, and meeting for conversation over coffee and/or good food. She is hoping to find an office-away-from-her-office at a quaint coffee shop in Hanover, where she will write her sermons, blog entries, and periodic newspaper columns.


