All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability. (Acts 2:4)

June 4 is Pentecost Sunday – a time to remember and celebrate the One who offers new life to all people. The Bible tells us that on that day, Jesus' followers were all gathered in one place and God sent the Holy Spirit to give them power to share the good news. They knew the Spirit was there because they could hear the sound of a mighty rushing wind coming from heaven. They couldn't hear the Spirit, but they could hear the sound of the wind. Then they saw what seemed to be flaming tongues of fire that came and rested on their heads. They couldn't see the Spirit, but could see the light of the flames.

They knew the Holy Spirit was present. We are looking for skilled individuals who are willing to serve on special projects with and through our Building Committee ie: finish painting our back hall before we can get started on replacing the carpet, deep cleaning the kitchen, reinforcing the shelving in the 2nd floor back room, helping with routine maintenance (cleaning) coils and fan on appliances. These are all things that may not take much time but need to do be done to keep our equipment operating at maximum capacity. We do need individuals willing to serve on our Building Committee as well as those willing to help by project. This has been a concern for a while, but it is reaching a crucial point! Consider how you might use your God given talents to help us maintain the buildings that house ministries that do work for so many individuals.

We are still seeking help for the Clothing Bank. Sorters and people to help lift and move things are needed. This is a ministry that in the past was helped by church teams coming in on a certain day of the month. There are still a few churches that have teams come to work on their day. We would love to see a return to those days (which started almost 50 years ago). Again the answer to the need is prayer that God will move among our people to enable individuals or groups to volunteer. *Blessings to all*

SPOTLIGHT ON MINISTRY

In a continuing feature for our newsletter we will highlight a ministry from a volunteers' experience. It is important to understand how those who do the work on a daily basis see Who We Are and What We Do!

!! CHANGING LIVES SHELTER TEN YEAR ANNIVERSARY !!

June 21, 2007 was a good bright sunny day in Hanover. It was the first day of summer and it was the day Hanover Area Council of Churches opened Changing Lives Shelter. It was a day that brought to fruition the hard work of so many people to bring to Hanover a year round homeless shelter. The Lord helped us accomplish what so many people said could not be done, He provided the funding that was nothing short of a miracle, and he provided staff and volunteers that were devoted to our mission of helping those in homelessness "... by meeting their immediate needs while seeking to provide a successful lifestyle change by addressing the root cause of their situation".

We have offered Case Management, Financial Counseling, Life Skills, Employment resources, Referrals to other agencies, support for re-housing, and basic needs to nearly 3,000 men, women and children since that day ten years ago. Forty-five percent of those who came to us for help left us to go to apartments or rooms or were placed in programs such as Turning Point Interfaith Mission or Veterans programs. Many have left on their own accord, and chose not to tell us where they were going. And sadly about 10% have left the shelter for cause.

The blessings of working with the homeless population far outweigh the negatives. The saddest lesson learned is that you cannot help everyone, especially when help is not wanted and an individual is just looking for a place to stay for a while. Conversely the greatest feeling comes when people leave successfully and return much later to say thank you that their time at Changing Lives Shelter helped them out of their darkest hour. The greatest feeling though has come from individuals who did not "get it" while here, but a few years later have et us know that the seeds planted took root and grew. **Definitely a Praise the Lord!!!**

!! THANK GOD.....AND THANK YOU !!

Hazel and I would like to say THANK YOU for the many prayers, cards, notes of encouragement, calls, visits, gifts of food, and everyone who provided transportation for Hazel during our time of struggle. With therapy, I am healing and getting stronger every day. I have regained feeling in my face and, although weak I am regaining feeling and strength in my left arm. My left leg is being obstinate and is doing its best to refuse to cooperate. With determination, continued prayer and therapy I am convinced I will return to full health. If THAT is not to be, I am certain there have been others whom have adjusted and I will do my best as well. I have said this privately but I would like to say publicly a special THANK YOU to a HACC Volunteer, Michael Faust. I am convinced his immediate and quick action saved my life. As I was experiencing the stroke I remember calling out for help and as I regained consciousness I realized I was lying in Mike's lap. A special THANK YOU to Carol Hinkle for making certain Hazel was discretely notified and brought to the hospital. I have also been told that the immediate response of all involved allowed me to arrive at the E.R. Department of Hanover Hospital during "The Window of Opportunity" to receive a "Miracle Drug" known as a "Clot Buster", thus minimizing the nerve damage. The knowledge, the skill, the dedication, the speed of the emergency personnel at the hospital was all being used by my Lord and Savior Jesus Christ in my hour of crisis.

After release from the hospital I spent a few weeks in the Rehabilitation Center of the Utz Terrace Skilled Care Center where I received Physical and Occupational Therapy and became strong enough to return home. Thank you to the nurses and support personnel for their love and professional care. Today, as I work to complete this article of Thanks I have just begun my third session of Out Patient Physical Therapy and I am certain by the time this goes to print I will have completed all physical therapy. There is absolutely NO WAY I can complete this article without saying THANK YOU to another HACC volunteer. You see, my health Insurance company will only allow for outpatient physical therapy two times a week. BUT, Bob Benscoter, a retired Physical Therapist has come to my home every day the insurance Therapist is not scheduled and works with me for as long as 2 hours each time. It is amazing the difference an additional 6 hours of therapy each week has made.

I will do as much as I am able to further the mission of HACC and in particular, PAL, from my home until my recovery is complete. I thank Carol Hinkle for the opportunity to stay involved. Until then, thank you for everything you have done to support me and my family and Thank You for your continued support of the Hanover Area Council of Churches.







Seniors who are living in a nursing home, personal care home, or other residential

facilities where meals are provided are NOT eligible to receive vouchers.

VOUCHERS CAN BE REDEEMED FROM June 1 through November 30. Individuals are eligible to receive the vouchers ONLY ONCE per calendar year.
