Celebrate Recovery/Smart Recovery/Alcoholics Anonymous/Narcotics Anonymous

Celebrate Recovery is a program here at Hanover Area Council of Churches which meets every Friday from 7:00pm to 9:00 pm lead by Minister Ronald Thomas.

This is a Christ- centered program that gives people the resources to help aid in the recovery from life's hurts, habits or hang-ups. It's the first step to recovery. Anyone who is struggling with past or current dysfunctions or compulsions. Come on in and let staff on board help you, guide you, talk to you, encourage you, and show you love. Let's help each other.

Celebrate Recovery offers a person the opportunity to participate in group fellowship where love and hope combine with God's purpose to mend our lives.

Ask yourself:

- Are there things in my life that I do that hurt others?
- Is there something I wish I could live without?
- Do I have a hard time saying "No" to others or setting boundaries?
- Do I have a painful habit or hang-up from which I need to be freed?

SMART Recovery is an alternative to 12-step recovery programs. Individuals utilize SMART as a solitary program, as well as in partnership with their current 12-step recovery program. SMART is based on science and reason, which utilizes evidence-based practices and areas of cognitive behavioral therapy. Meetings focus on the current recovery life issues instead of past usage. During meetings persons are able to dispute irrational beliefs about life areas and situations which are impeding their forward progression. SMART benefits all walks of life be it individuals in and out of addiction. While focusing on Urges and Cravings, Managing Thoughts, Feelings, and Behaviors, Building and Maintaining Motivation for Change, and Living a Balanced Lifestyle, SMART assists persons that are just having a difficult time getting along or going through life's trials. Meetings are facilitated in an open discussion format. As a community we can help each other to get through the issues we believed we were dealing with alone. Everyone's circumstances are different in life, but our peers have also went through similar instances. SMART utilizes these experiences and offers hope in working through our difficult times.

We also have **Narcotics Anonymous** (every Saturday 7pm) and **Alcoholics Anonymous** (every Sunday 8am) who hold meetings in our building for many years. We want to thank them for all they have done and do helping people in so many ways who are in recovery.

Each month on the fourth Saturday we meet for breakfast, have a Bible study and business meeting.



2019 Annual Report of the Stolte Scholarship Committee

Those interested are asked to complete an application and submit a brief summary of their call into ministry and future vocational goals. In rewarding the scholarship, consideration is given to the individual's academic achievement, honors and awards, church and school involvements, financial need, and aspirations. Application forms were made available through area pastors, high school guidance offices, the Lutheran Theological Seminary at Gettysburg, and the Hanover Area Council of Churches office. In 2019, the applications were due April 30th.

Ms. Loy is a graduate of New Oxford High School and will be attending West Virginia University where she will be majoring in Nursing. In addition, she has spent two weeks at the Broad Street Ministry in Philadelphia.





Need Help Mowing? Call for a Rent-A-Kid in Your Area

York County seniors interested in help with mowing during the summer months are encouraged to arrange for a Rent-A-Kid.

The Rent-A-Kid program, sponsored by the York County Area Agency on Aging, is an intergenerational program that connects York County older adults and teenagers together.

For over 30 years, Kids have been helping and learning from older adults through the Rent-A-Kid program. It gives individual teenagers the chance to help York County adults age 60 years or older, with indoor and outdoor household chores. The older adult needs to be agreeable to a reimbursement of a minimum of \$5/hour, or a negotiated rate based on the job.



The Hanover Church of the Brethren is collecting items for disaster relief buckets to be used where flooding or disasters occurred.

The following items are needed:

- One five-gallon bucket with resealable lid (If bucket has been used, clean well but do not use if it has held chemicals of any kind.)
- Four scouring pads
- Seven sponges, including one large
- One scrub brush
- Eighteen reusables, lightweight dry-cleaning towels (e.g. Handi wipes)
- One 50 oz. or two 25 oz. bottle(s) of liquid laundry detergent
- One 16-28 oz. bottle of liquid disinfectant dish soap
- One 12-16 oz. bottle of household cleaner that can be mixed with water (no spray bottles)
- One package of 48-50 clothespins
- Clothesline, two 50 ft. or one 100 ft.
- Five dust masks
- Two pairs heavy-duty, waterproof dishwashing gloves (latex-free, non-surgical)
- One pair work gloves, cotton with leather palm or all leather
- 24-28 heavy duty or contractor type 30-45 gallon trash bags on a roll and removed from carton
- One 6-9 oz. bottle of non-aerosol insect repellent
