- ♦ Provide-A-Lunch (PAL) to over 50,000 last year
- ♦ Homeless shelter 24/7 and 365 days a year
- ♦ Medical clinic
- ♦ Ruth's Harvest (weekend backpack meals for school children)
- ♦ Community gardens
- ♦ Casework services to enable people to get jobs and housing
- ♦ A budget of over half a million dollars
