#### FROM OUR PAST TO OUR PRESENT

We have spent the last year looking at the beginnings of the Hanover Area Council of Churches and hearing from past volunteers. We have looked at how the ministries have changed as the community needs have changed. We have been blessed by individuals and groups who saw the need and approached the Council to provide a means to meet the need.

Foremost was the Cold Weather Shelter (2001) that after only six winters became a year round shelter: Changing Lives Shelter (2007). This is also the only ministry that we operate that requires paid staff as well as volunteers since the shelter is open 22 hours per day, every day of the year. We have emerged through a strictly emergency shelter to a working shelter that allows people to stay longer than 30 days if each one is doing everything necessary to change their situation. Ruth's Harvest which is weekend meals for elementary children in the Hanover School District who

Ruth's Harvest which is weekend meals for elementary children in the Hanover School District who are eligible for free or reduced lunches was started through a "partnership grant" with Community Aid. We have been very grateful to the community for its generosity and gratified to know that children are not going hungry on weekends.

The Hispanic American Center of Hanover has also in the past 3 years been added to our umbrella. This ministry holds a Kid's Day each year and a Diversity Summit, it assist with citizenship, translations and more. It has brought a PAL team to prepare breakfast and lunch the first Saturday of the month the Hispanic congregation which meets at Covenant Life Church Iglesia Pacto de Vida. This is a marvelous way to experience a different culture.

As we move forward we will be forming a new Long Range Planning Committee after the first of the year. We welcome all who would like to be a part of this important work. We will evaluate what we do and how we do it. We will look at the immediate needs of our community and search for means to meet it if not already being met. We will be calling on the public to help us in the endeavor and urge you to be willing to participate.

We are very grateful to all who have volunteered with us past and present and with God's help we will be able to continue for as long as we are needed. Thank you for 50 years!!!




