From the desk of Carol Hinkle (HACC Director)

We are always surprised when time seems to fly by. In a matter of days we will be 90 days from Christmas 2018, where has the year gone? I have discovered that the older I get the faster it goes. In fact I have been thinking about 50 Years of serving the people of the Hanover Area and how thankful we are that the Lord has guided us and enabled us represent Him. I think of some of the ministries that were once part of what the Council did in the community and how it has been necessary to adjust our ministries to fit the current realities of our society.

We had been operating fifteen years before starting our Provide –A-Lunch ministry which started out of a need. Our Cold Weather Shelter and consequently Changing Lives Shelter came after thirty-three years into our ministries. Our medical Clinic is has been operating at various strengths since 2012---forty four years into HACC. Ruth's Harvest is in its fifth year of serving the children of Hanover Public School District, forty-five years into service. Adding a Bilingual Case Worker for our daytime ministries has only been a service for three and a half years. The Hispanic American Center of Hanover has only been adopted as our ministry for three years (although they were operating in Hanover for many years). Adding SMART Recovery to our collaborations three years ago was born from the growing addiction problems in our community and nation. This will be a partnership that I unfortunately see continuing for the fore seeable future.

We look at each of our ministries to determine the improvements or even the necessity of a particular ministry or service. The ability to meet the needs of so many people who are suffering and be an asset to all in our sphere of influence, at times is a tightrope walk. ENDING HUNGER ONE STEP AT A TIME

Once again it's time for us to come together for a few hours, and walk a few miles to raise funds to end hunger here at home and around the world. The 42nd annual Hanover CROP Walk will be held on October 21st.

There have been many changes in our community, our county, and our world since that first Hanover CROP Walk in 1976. One thing that has not changed, however, is that **hunger continues to be one of the greatest injustices facing our world.** Hunger kills more people every year than AIDS, malaria, and tuberculosis combined; 795 million people worldwide do not have enough food to lead a healthy active life; there are more people displaced and in refugee camps now than since the end of the second world war. Too many people, many of them children, are still living with hunger and dying in poverty. This is why we have walked, and continue to walk, on that third Sunday in October each year.

Another thing that has not changed is the commitment of Church World Service (CWS) to make their vision a reality: the vision of a world where all have food, voice and a safe place to call home. We have walked for 41 years, and will continue to walk this year, to support the ministry of CWS as they work to save lives of the most vulnerable around the world. We also continue to walk to help the most vulnerable here in the Hanover area with a portion of monies raised coming back to support hunger-fighting programs in our community.

I began my time as executive director at the very start of 1997. It was a fresh start, a time of excitement and transition for the Hanover Area of Council of Churches, as all our ministries were settling into their new, shared home at 136 Carlisle Street. What had been many, were in the process of becoming one.

As I became familiar with the construct of the organization, I was blown away by the volume and vitality of our many volunteers! Coming in, I had no idea of the people-power involved in the day to day operation of our (then) 12 ministries, as well as caring for our newly-renovated building. I did some math and found that our volunteers were roughly 1000 members strong! PAL, Clothing Bank, Meals on Wheels, Faith at Work, front desk receptionists, the board and so many committees being formed...small and large tasks that needed doing. My heart was warmed, as I realized what a beautiful statement our existence made about the town of Hanover, who we are, and what we stand for.

One of our first tasks involved developing a logo and motto to represent our individual ministries combined as one servant organization. In February '97, I wrote in the Council News, "I have been inspired by the commitment and beautiful attitude of service here, as we share a common goal of reaching out to others in the name of Christ. It is a real spirit of unity. I am reminded of St. Paul's words in Ephesians 4, "There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to the one hope of your calling, one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all...."

From this scripture, our motto was born! **One Body. One Spirit.** Artist Karen Huston worked on the graphics and presented us with sketches and ideas. One stood out. The quilt patch well-represented, in our context, an organization that was made up of many parts unified into one whole body. It was an excellent logo to illustrate **One Body. One Spirit**. In September of 1997, it was approved by our Board of Directors.

20 years later, it is with a warm heart that I witness this thriving body of Christ still giving beautiful testimony to the quilt made up of many patches. As **One Body and One Spirit**, the Hanover Area Council of Churches continues to reach out in large and small ways to our community in the name of Christ.


