The Lord has blessed us greatly as we have been led to alleviate hunger, homelessness and poverty in our community on Christ's behalf. In 2007, when we were struggling with the initial cost of Changing Lives Homeless Shelter to our budget, He directed a friend who helped us so we could open without incurring long term debt. When our initial state shelter grant through York County ran out and later grant amounts were cut, the Lord sent Glen Chandler and Community Aid with the offer to partner with us when their new store opened in Hanover. Within a year we were receiving Partners Grants of \$100,000.00 a year to be used as we needed, but with the understanding that we expand our ministries. We added new ministries such as Ruth's Harvest, Community Gardens, a bilingual case worker, expanded prescription assistance, the Hispanic American Center, and assistance for immediate needs for individuals and families. These programs allowed us to further address hunger in our community, especially among school-aged children, help English and Spanish speaking neighbors become more self-sufficient, and improve the health of the Hanover area community overall.

As we added ministries our budget increased, but the blessing of the Partnership Grants saw us through these increases. One unfortunate consequence of our partnership with Community Aid was that a few individual donors reduced their giving because of the grant. That coupled with the recent death or illness of long-term givers has changed our giver profile. We did build up our donor platform and thought we were in good shape to meet our 2020 budget. Unfortunately, Community Aid (under new leadership) has just announced a change in their business model and we will no longer receive the Partnership Grants.

Under new qualifying guidelines, the 2020 priorities for Community Aid Partnership Grants are: addressing homelessness, alleviating hunger, promoting self-sufficiency, and helping people succeed. Although we believe it is clear that we have been successfully pursuing these priorities, Community Aid will

choose only 6 Major Partners for grants of three years duration and those partners MUST have an annual budget of \$1,000,000. Our annual budget is half of that.

Clearly, we are disappointed that Community Aid has chosen this route for their future, but we are still thankful for the partnership we enjoyed with them. These changes mean we need to find ways to replace \$100,000 in our annual budget so that we may continue current ministries without having to make drastic cuts to program and or staff. Community Aid Partner Grants covered 25% of our actual expenses. Within a few short weeks we will start preparing our 2020 budget, so this is an issue that needs to be addressed with some urgency. At this time we are forming a task force to work on finding various possible solutions. If you would like to serve on this task force, please notify our office at 717-633-6353 as soon as possible. We are looking to you, our members and friends to pray for us for wisdom and faith and to make recommendations for further sources of funding that we can use to cover this loss "one prayer at a time".

Eligibility Guidelines:

- 60 years of age or older (PROOF REQUIRED)
- York County resident (PROOF REQUIRED)
- GROSS ANNUAL HOUSEHOLD INCOME:
 AT OR BELOW \$23,107/single person & \$31,284/couple

When picking up vouchers for another individual (including spouse) the following is required

\$20 FREE voucher (one set per yr/per person) for use at local Farm Markets for fresh fruits & vegetables

A 2018 SFMNP Proxy form only will be accepted with proof of ages & York County resident verification for the person you are picking up for.

Photo ID for Proxy.

Seniors who are living in a nursing home, personal care home, or other residential facilities where meals are provided are NOT eligible to receive youchers.

Sponsored by the York County Area Agency on Aging in conjunction with the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture.

VOUCHERS CAN BE REDEEMED FROM June 1 through November 30.

Individuals are eligible to receive the vouchers ONLY ONCE per calendar year.



The Hanover Church of the Brethren is collecting items for disaster relief buckets to be used where flooding or disasters occurred. The following items are needed:

- One five-gallon bucket with resealable lid (If bucket has been used, clean well but do not donate if it has held chemicals of any kind.)
- Four scouring pads
- Seven sponges, including one large
- One scrub brush
- Eighteen reusable, lightweight dry cleaning towels (e.g. Handi wipes)
- One 50 oz. or two 25 oz. bottle(s) of liquid laundry detergent
- One 16-28 oz. bottle of liquid disinfectant dish soap
- One 12-16 oz. bottle of household cleaner that can be mixed with water (no spray bottles)
- One package of 48-50 clothespins
- Clothesline, two 50 ft. or one 100 ft.
- · Five dust masks
- Two pairs heavy-duty, waterproof dishwashing gloves (latex-free, non-surgical)
- One pair work gloves, cotton with leather palm or all leather
- 24-28 heavy duty or contractor type 30-45 gallon trash bags on a roll and removed from carton
- One 6-9 oz. bottle of non-aerosol insect repellent

Need Help Mowing? Call for a Rent-A-Kid in Your Area

York County seniors interested in help with mowing during the summer months are encouraged to arrange for a Rent-A-Kid.

The Rent-A-Kid program, sponsored by the York County Area Agency on Aging, is an intergenerational program that connects York County older adults and teenagers together.

For over 30 years, Kids have been helping and learning from older adults through the Rent-A-Kid program. It gives individual teenagers the chance to help York County adults age 60 years or older, with indoor and outdoor household chores. The older adult needs to be agreeable to a reimbursement of a minimum of \$5/hour, or a negotiated rate based on the job.


