From the desk of Carol Hinkle (HACC Director)

We are grateful to First United Methodist Middle St. Campus for housing this ministry from its inception and are thankful for the amount of time given to find a new location before they shutter the building. .

So often it is the challenges we face that bring the greatest blessings. We here at the Council have had that experience time after time. When there is an obstacle, the Lord has shown a way around the problem or has been there carrying us through the problem. In any difficulty there is always a reason to give thanks: we have gained some new volunteers which we


