Blessing number two along came Deb and Sandy to help with back kitchen work at PAL. Sandy has been able to help throughout the ordeal; helping to prepare the carry outs for PAL, prepping veggies etc. for the teams, and so very much more including handling a lot of donated food. Blessing number three, Marie who volunteered in the Clothing Bank and then came to help prepare and serve the carry outs, as well as fill in for receptionists and anything else that has been needed because she wanted to give back. Blessing number four, Mary who came to be a receptionist then moved to the shelter in the mornings and then went to the kitchen to help wherever needed. All such blessings, all so thankful to be here to help. What more could we need.

Our thanks to all who have brought donations, offered help, have gone above and beyond the jobs they were here to do. All that keeps going through my mind is "God is Good all the time; all the time God is Good" He hears the cry of His people so we keep crying out.


