

#### **Changing Lives Shelter News**

The shelter is open but remains on a limited capacity. The following guidelines are in place.

Potential Residents must have lived in York County (excluding York City) for at least four to six months; Residents are subjected to random drug and alcohol testing. The Shelter is operating on a one-person per room basis. During this time, the Shelter has the capacity to hold six men, six woman and two families. Currently we have rooms available for men, women and two families. The Shelter is in operation 22-hours a day, 7-days a week. The Shelter closes each day between 11am and 1pm.

The Shelter has implemented the temperature monitoring system to safeguard our Residents and Staff. Volunteers are currently needed in the Shelter during the afternoon from 1pm-5pm and 5pm -8pm evenings.

**Job Openings**: The Shelter is currently looking to hire Intake Office Personnel for the shifts 1pm - 5pm; 5pm -11pm; and 11pm - 7a. You can find an application on Indeed.com or email your Resume to admin@hanoverareacouncilofchurches.org.

# **Thank You!**

Have you ever received gifts where "Thank you "is just sooo inadequate? You just knew that the Lord had blessed you so gloriously that it was hard to contain yourself. It was as if Christmas came several days each month because the blessings kept flowing. Everyday has become a praise day here at the Hanover Area Council of Churches. The people of Hanover have been very generous in troubling times.

In a Covid19 world, our ministries had to undergo some major changes. Foremost among those were the changes in the preparation and serving of the Provide-A-Lunch meals every day. We had to make a paid position for someone to head up our PAL ministry. The method of service to the community became a To-Go system. All our supplies became disposable items and our fruit individual portions. During the course of all this happening our walk-in freezer needed major work. The extra cost of cleaning supplies, gloves, thermometers, and masks mounted up; and yet God blessed us with generous people who gave us gifts of funds designated for covid19 expenses as well as individuals and organizations who made many masks for our workers including kitchen, shelter, and Meals on Wheels.

The donations of food from restaurants for our lunch ministry and businesses that purchased restaurant meals for our shelter, MOWS, and PAL ministries were such a blessing to everyone. Our Changing Lives Shelter is only at 50% of individual occupancy along with two family rooms. We had lost many of our volunteers with the shut downs, although some have returned, we have incurred extra expenses using paid staff during usual volunteer times.

Even though Covid19 closed schools in March, we were blessed to be able to serve the elementary children of Hanover School District with weekend meals through June thanks to the school administration. We served 275 students weekly 7 meals /weekend with your gifts of food and donations.

The Lord has allowed us to fulfill our purpose here at the Council through the generosity of so many: individual donors, churches (both Member and non-member), school districts, local Service Clubs, local Foundations, small businesses and large corporations.

I honestly believe when we are doing the work the Lord has appointed us to His blessings will abound and His purpose will be served. We cannot thank all of you who have supported us this past year through this pandemic with funding, gifts and supplies and the strongest of all your prayers.

We know we have a building in need of repairs and a community in need of assistance they didn't anticipate and changes coming for which we are not prepared, but we also know that we have and serve a Lord who is greater than all that is ahead of us. Please continue to support our needs and those who come seeking help and to hold us in prayer as we hold the Greater Hanover Area in prayer and put our trust in God as He knows the end from the beginning.

In a horrible year of 2020, we have many reasons to give thanks and praise to God for all of you!!!!!!!!!!



#### A Meaningful Gift

Another way is to leave a stated percentage: "I give, devise, and bequest to Hanover Council of Churches in Hanover, PA an amount equal to \_\_percent (\_\_%) of the value of my estate or some account e.g. retirement, investment, insurance policy, savings/checking, etc. account."
