From the desk of Rev. Nancy Werner (Council President)

"Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice." (Philippians 4:4) Notice what comes up in your thoughts and feelings when you read this verse. Does it feel more like a command? Does it feel like gratitude could rise naturally from your current circumstances, or would you have to work at it?

Given all that has happened this year, more things in our lives are complicated and unresolved on an individual level and on the community and national level. The approaching Thanksgiving holiday makes us, as God's people, wrestle with this question, "How do we rejoice when things are complicated and unresolved?" St. Paul wrote, "Rejoice in the Lord always..." He did not write, "Rejoice in the Lord when everything gets back to normal."

St. Paul's words emphasize that now is the time for rejoicing! Now is the time to thank the Lord. Now is the time to live with hope, even though we are facing an unknown future.

All of us know that people and objects do not cease to exist when we cannot see them. Pause and think for a moment or recall in your mind what the sun feels like on your skin. This is possible in the dark of night or sheltered inside. Think for a moment or recall in your mind a time when you were very thirsty. Did you believe water still existed even though you were that thirsty? Are you able to quiet your mind, center your thoughts on the Lord, relax your muscles, and recognize the Lord's blessings in the present moment? This action is recalling what peace feels like even when you are knee-deep in difficulties, challenges, demands, pain or suffering. Rejoicing always is a very similar practice.

Rejoicing or gratitude is a spiritual practice and an expression of faith. Faith declares, "I will look first for what God has already done for me," and not merely on what God has not yet done or not yet done to my expectations.

Circumstances around COVID-19 have prevented us from rejoicing together at our community Thanksgiving Eve worship service. However, those circumstances will not silence the rejoicing occurring wherever God's faithful people happen to be on Thanksgiving!

Changing Lives Shelter News

The shelter is open but remains on a limited capacity. The following guidelines are in place.

Potential Residents must have lived in York County (excluding York City) for at least four to six months; Residents are subjected to random drug and alcohol testing. The Shelter is operating on a one-person per room basis.

During this time, the Shelter has the capacity to hold six men, six woman and two families. Currently we have rooms available for men, women and two families. The Shelter is in operation 22-hours a day, 7-days a week. The Shelter closes each day between 11am and 1pm.

The Shelter has implemented the temperature monitoring system to safeguard our Residents and Staff. Volunteers are currently needed in the Shelter during the afternoon from 1pm-5pm and 5pm -8pm evenings.

<u>Job Openings</u>: The Shelter is currently looking to hire Intake Office Personnel for the shifts 1pm - 5pm; 5pm -11pm; and 11pm - 7a. You can find an application on Indeed.com or email your Resume to admin@hanoverareacouncilofchurches.org.




