What a different Easter Season we have experienced in 2020! The idea of watching Maundy Thursday Service on YouTube and finding crackers and juice or wine for Communion are all unique to all of us this year.

COVID19 has brought the world to its knees; but how good it is to know that our Lord is still at the right hand of God and that God is not asking "what just happened?" No matter how we celebrated Easter Day and the Fifty Days in the Easter Season it changes nothing about the meaning of the season and the goodness of God. By the changes in our perpetually whirling schedules and driven need to be on the go, we are staying home playing games with our children, eating meals together, and talking to each other. As costly as this virus has been in lives, pensions, and loss of jobs and of businesses, there has been good from this pandemic.

Hearts have opened to find ways to help where each person has gifts and abilities. From those who have the ability to pull together fundraisers, who now find that they have the time to volunteer to those who have made masks (another new experience). Those who can supply food for needy families as food banks are struggling to meet the needs of the growing number of people struggling to keep food on their tables. As the unemployment

St. Paul described the good news of God's everlasting love this way, "For I am certain that nothing can separate us from God's love: neither death nor life, neither angels nor other heavenly rulers or powers, neither the present nor the future, ³⁹ neither the world above nor the world below—there is nothing in all creation that will ever be able to separate us from the love of God which is ours through Christ Jesus our Lord." (Romans 8:38-39, GNT)

The resurrection of Jesus on that first Easter morn showed us the Truth (with a capital T) that nothing is stronger or more powerful than God's everlasting love. This is especially good news to me this year because of the protective

rolls have climbed to 26 million-plus, we here at the council are so very grateful for all the help we have received to serve the population in need. We are fighting the food insecurity for an average of 150 people a day and approximately 200 students over weekends on back-pack meals.

The Hanover School District will continue to serve free and reduced lunches until June 1. We would very much like to find a way to continue to serve these children for as long as it takes. Our difficulties are twofold: 1) being the lack of help and 2) the need to find a new location for Ruth's Harvest to call home. We will lose our base of operations as of June 1. If you are able to support us in either of these two areas, please call our office at 717-633-6353.

During the last several weeks where people have been forced to stay at home, the Council has found itself quite blessed by the generosity of local businesses that are unable to work at capacity and have shared their excess with us as we feed hundreds of our neighbors daily.

Our blessings include:

Food from restaurants such as Dutch Country, Bay City, Blue Koi, MOD Pizza, UTZ Quality Foods, Hanover and Southwestern School Districts and so many anonymous donations that have stretched our food budget tremendously. We also received very generous funding for food from the Campbell's Corporation.

While our own teams are temporarily sidelined, there have been numerous people who have stepped up to volunteer to make meals and hand them out.

We are grateful for all the gifts from our community that help fund our mission in these difficult times—both corporate and personal gifts.

The shelter residents and staff of HACC were pleased to receive delicious food donations of pizza from Trinity UCC and Mod Pizza along with dinner from Three Hogs Barbecue. Many people have benefited from the hundreds of masks donated from thoughtful individuals. We are in their debt!

Once again, I would ask that we keep each other in prayer during this difficult time and always remember that God is in control.


