Changing Lives Shelter News

The shelter is open but remains on a limited capacity. The following guidelines are in place.

Potential Clients must have lived in York County (excluding York City) for at least four to six months; Clients are subjected to random drug and alcohol testing. The Shelter is operating on a one-person per room basis.

During this time, the Shelter has the capacity to hold six men, six woman and two families. Currently we have rooms available for men, women and two families. The Shelter is in operation 22-hours a day, 7-days a week. The Shelter closes each day between 11am and 1pm.

The Shelter has implemented the temperature monitoring system to safeguard our Clients and Staff. Volunteers are currently needed in the Shelter during the afternoon from 1pm-5pm.

Job Openings: The Shelter is currently looking to hire Intake Office Personnel for the shifts 1pm - 5pm; 5pm -11pm; and 11pm - 7a. You can find an application on Indeed.com or email your Resume to admin@hanoverareacouncilofchurches.org.


