A letter from Carol Hinkle

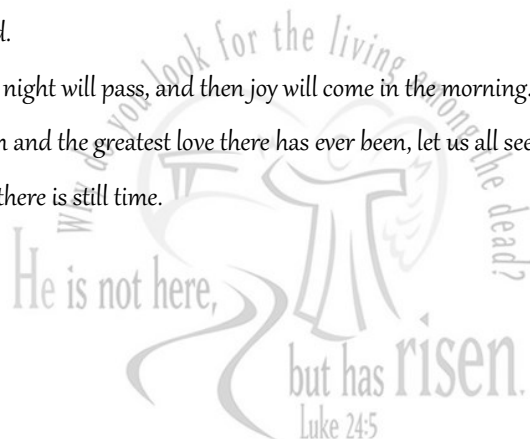
HACC Executive Director

I have just recovered from Covid-19. My diagnosis came as a complete shock because I had received my 1st shot and had escaped the illness on so many occasions. I thought I was home free since my 2nd shot was scheduled for 8 days later. Over-confidence is a terrible disease also. When I opened my hospital portal and saw all the written instructions it took me a few minutes to realize what I was reading. I read the words "self-isolate for the next ten days". I really was stunned. but before long it sunk in and I heard my granddaughter's words when this all started a year ago. She said, "You need to stay home because you are old and you can die." Now a year later I was facing her deepest fear. I have, since I was saved by my Lord, believed the words of Paul who wrote "For me to live is Christ, and to die is gain." (Phil. 1:21).

I found myself actually thinking of the possibility (to the point of writing the order of my service) and I realize I am okay with dying. It was not something I just told my family and friends, but I also realized though I know there is an appointed time, I hoped this was not it. I felt had I things unfinished and prayed that the Lord still had work for me to do here. A loving God restored my peace and I am so thankful I am able to sit and write about those feelings.

This Lenten Season is almost at a close and I do not think I ever did so much introspection. However, as I examine my life, I am aware of so many things done wrong and thank God again for the time to live more closely with Christ, to seek and to do His will. Even as I make that prayer, I find I have to beg forgiveness for "the flesh is weak." Monday I return to the office with a new resolve and a greater sense of wanting to serve my Master than I have experienced in a while. A deeper and more urgent sense of praying for and serving others is utmost in my heart and mind.

Now, Easter is just a few weeks away, the dark night will pass, and then joy will come in the morning. With the greatest message the world has ever known and the greatest love there has ever been, let us all seek to share this news with those in our world while there is still time.

“Peace be with you.” These are the first words spoken by our risen Lord Jesus Christ when he appeared to the disciples on the evening of the first Easter (John 20:19-21).

Changing Lives Shelter News

The Changing Lives Shelter remains on a limited capacity, with the following guidelines in place:

1. The Shelter office operates 22-hours a day, 7-days a week. The Shelter closes each day between 11am and 1pm. Potential residents must have lived in the Greater Hanover Area for at least four to six months;
2. The Shelter is operating on a one-person per room basis, due to Covid-19. The Shelter has the capacity to hold six men, six woman and two families.
3. Residents are subjected to mandatory random drug and alcohol testing. The Shelter has implemented the temperature monitoring system to safeguard our Residents and Staff.
4. Volunteers are currently needed in the Shelter during the afternoon/evening from 1pm-5pm and 5pm-8pm.

The Hanover Area Council of Churches would like to make the Community aware of the Stolte Scholarship Fund. The Fund was established in 1973 in memory of Rev. Robert H. Stolte, pastor of Lohr's Memorial United Methodist Church in Hanover from 1962-1973. The administration of the fund has been handled by the Hanover Area Council of Churches and has been supported with the offerings received at the Community Good Friday Service and with private donations.

The Stolte Scholarship Fund provides a one-time grant of \$1,000.00 to an individual pursuing a career in the field of **ministry, missions, or humanitarian service**.

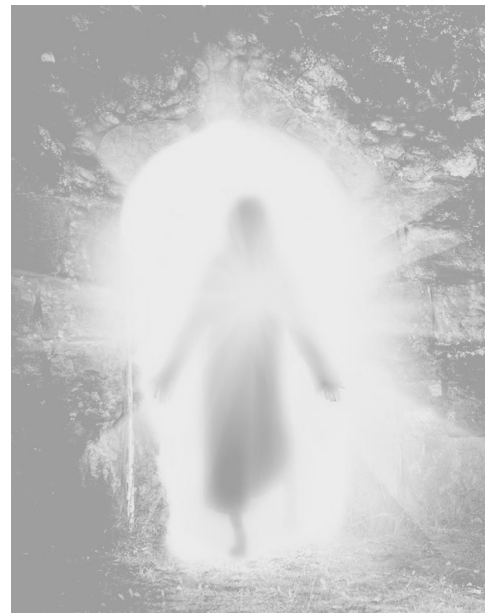

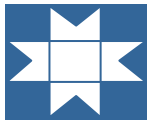
