A letter from Carol Hinkle HACC Executive Director

During the Lenten Season it has been the tradition of many to "give up" something that may or may not be really important to everyday life. Some people are very sincere in abstinence and sacrifice. I would like to share what I have learned not having come from a tradition that observed Lent in this same manner.

Instead of giving up something like dessert or chocolate, Lent was a good time to add something to the daily routine. Whether you are adding an additional time for devotions, more and deeper prayer, or just time to sit and meditate on what the Lord has shown you in your daily reading, there is much to be gained by adding it to your lives. If you still want to give up something, give up some of your time to help those in need with a kind word, a handwritten card of encouragement, an hour of your time to run errands, or a homecooked meal to share with someone.

There are so many small things that are such a blessing to a recipient and cost little or nothing to give. If we determined to do this each week or twice a week our lives would be so much richer as we share the love of Christ with others. The more we do through love, the more we are able to reflect the love of Christ as a witness to others. In a COVID world, this may be a little more difficult and need more planning than pre-pandemic. On the other hand, there may be even more opportunity for prayers, cards and phone calls to those who may feel isolated and lonely. The pandemic is terrible, but there may be an opportunity to all who love the Lord to share that love in a new or different way.

I would like to point out to anyone who would be interested that there is still plenty of opportunity to serve the Lord in our ministries through the Hanover Area Council of Churches. If you wish to help with PAL, MOWs, Ruth's Harvest, Clothing Bank or Changing Lives Shelter, we are using safe practices: social distancing, temperature checks, handwashing and masks worn at all times. Numbers are limited for the number of people shopping in the Clothing Bank, staying in residence at CLS, or entering to receive a carryout lunch. People cooking and filling carryout containers stay in the kitchen with no contact with those receiving meals. We do everything we can to keep our volunteers safe from COVID.

As the Lord gives opportunity, let us all seek more way to experience Him and share Him in a world that needs the love of God more than ever.

Thank you to the pastors, the musicians, and the technical wizards whose efforts are creating a community Good Friday worship service online! It would only be an observance of betrayal and suffering except that Jesus' love for all people (the reason Jesus endured it all) didn't start or end on the cross. Jesus' love is rooted in or has its origin with God the Creator at the beginning of everything. Its ending is also in the hands of God the Creator who promises that we will never reach its ending.

It would only be an observance of betrayal and suffering except that Good Friday is one of the Three Days recalling Jesus' own words to his disciples that he would be handed over to death, and that "after three days he will rise again" (Mark 10:34). The Good Friday service is part of the journey beginning on Maundy Thursday and going through the evening on Easter Day; a journey with Christ through death into life.

When we walk with our Lord Jesus through the Three Days, there is more than suffering and death. There is forgiveness, salvation, and love! Good Friday reminds us of the cost Jesus paid for our forgiveness and salvation! I invite you to our Good Friday worship online and hear again how Jesus makes it so that nothing "...in all creation will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord!" (Romans 8:38).

The Changing Lives Shelter remains on a limited capacity, with the following guidelines in place:

- 1. The Shelter office operates 22-hours a day, 7-days a week. The Shelter closes each day between 11am and 1pm. Potential residents must have lived in the Greater Hanover Area for at least four to six months;
- 2. The Shelter is operating on a one-person per room basis, due to Covid-19. The Shelter has the capacity to hold six men, six woman and two families.
- 3. Residents are subjected to mandatory random drug and alcohol testing. The Shelter has implemented the temperature monitoring system to safeguard our Residents and Staff.
- 4. Volunteers are currently needed in the Shelter during the afternoon/evening from 1pm-5pm and 5pm-8pm.



Stolte Scholarship Fund

The Hanover Area Council of Churches would like to make the Community aware of the Stolte Scholarship Fund. The Fund was established in 1973 in memory of Rev. Robert H. Stolte, pastor of Lohr's Memorial United Methodist Church in Hanover from 1962-1973. 


