2021 Annual Report of the Stolte Scholarship Committee



Application forms were made available through area pastors, high school guidance offices, the United Lutheran Seminary's Gettysburg Campus, and the Hanover Area Council of Churches office. In 2021, the applications were due April 30th.




RUTH'S HARVEST

CHANGING LIVES SHELTER

The Changing Lives Shelter remains on a limited capacity, with the following guidelines in place:





- 2. The Shelter is operating on a one-person per room basis, due to Covid-19. The Shelter has the capacity to hold six men, six woman and two families. Once the State reaches their stated 70% in vaccinations we will then revisit the capacity guidelines
- 3. Residents are subjected to mandatory random drug and alcohol testing. The Shelter has implemented the temperature monitoring system to safeguard our Residents and Staff.
- 4. Volunteers are currently needed in the Shelter during the afternoon/evening from 1pm-5pm and 5pm-8pm.


