

## CLOTHING BANK

Our clothing Bank is open to the public. Come and shop Monday through Thursday from 9 am to 12 pm . We have many items including:

- Gently used clothing (all styles and sizes. Newborns, Children, Women, and Men)

Clothing is free, although monetary donations are appreciated. Other items are priced accordingly.

Appointments are made on the hour and are limited to 20 individuals (adult and children) at a time. You must wear a mask and obey social distancing rules while you shop. Stop by or call 717-633-6353 to make an appointment.

## CHANGING LIVES SHELTER

The Changing Lives Shelter remains on a limited capacity, with the following guidelines in place:

1. The Shelter office operates 22-hours a day, 7-days a week. The Shelter closes each day between 11am and 1pm. Potential residents must have lived in the Greater Hanover Area for at least four to six months if not they must have proof of a covid test or vaccination within a week of entry.
2. The Shelter is operating on a one-person per room basis, due to Covid-19. The Shelter has the capacity to hold six men, six woman and two families. Once the State reaches their stated 70% in vaccinations we will then revisit the capacity guidelines
3. Residents are subjected to mandatory random drug and alcohol testing. The Shelter has implemented the temperature monitoring system to safeguard our Residents and Staff.
4. Volunteers are currently needed in the Shelter during the afternoon/evening from 1pm-5pm and 5pm-8pm.

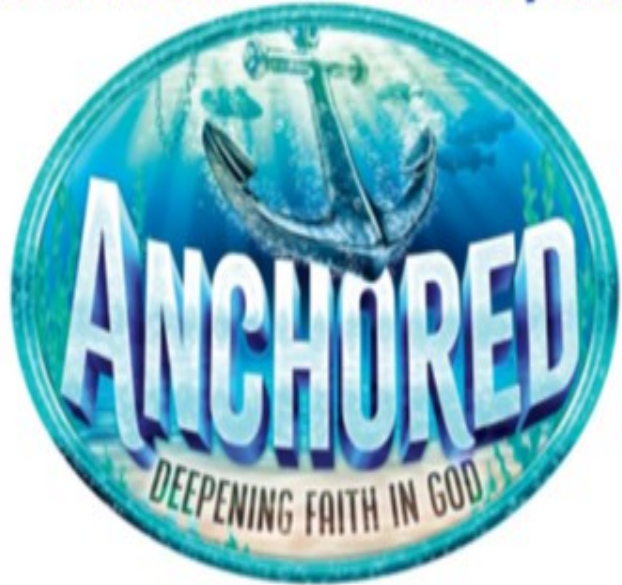

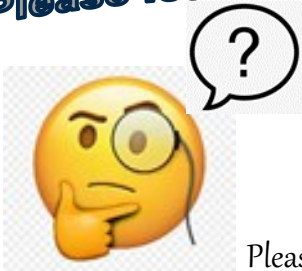
