




FROM THE DESK OF MIRNA WILDASIN INTERIM EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

CLOTHING BANK

Appointments are no longer necessary at this time. A mask is optional but we ask that you use hand sanitizer and please continue to obey social distancing rules while you shop.

Our clothing Bank is open to the public. Come and shop Monday— Thursday from 9 am to 12 pm. We have all styles and sizes of gently clothing for all used sizes (newborns, children, women, & men). We also have small housewares and linens.

Clothing is free, although monetary donations are appreciated. Other items are priced accordingly.

The clothing bank will also have hours every 2nd Saturday of the month.

CHANGING LIVES SHELTER

The Shelter operates 22-hours a day, 7-days a week and closes each day between 11AM to 1PM.

Potential residents must have lived in the Greater Hanover Area for at least four to six months and go through our intake process to determine if they are eligible to stay.

Due to Covid-19, the Shelter is limited to housing six men, six woman on a one-person per room basis, and two families.

Residents are subjected to mandatory random drug and alcohol testing.

Volunteers are currently needed in the Shelter one day a week from 7AM to 11AM.

We are still in need of fourteen chests of drawers and companion wall lockers. If you or your church are interested in helping with this project please contact 717-633-6353 for further details.

FROM THE OFFICE OF THE FUND DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

A Contribution that Allows a Deduction

As we prepare for end of the year finances and contributions, we often look for ways to reduce our federal taxes. In addition, many individuals look for ways to help the less fortunate. The Hanover Area Council of Churches (HACC) provides many important ministries that support the less fortunate in our community: a 24 hour shelter, warm meals every day (PAL lunch), weekend food for school children (Ruth's Harvest), Meals on Wheels for our local seniors and disabled citizens, a clothing bank, medical care resources and other social assistance as needed so people's lives may be changed for the better.

Because of the recent increase in the standard deduction, many people no longer itemize on their federal taxes. If you reached age 72 you typically must take a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) from your Individual Retirement Account (IRA). However, there is a way you can contribute to HACC and still reduce your taxes. You may use some or all of your RMD (up to \$100,000 for the year) to make a qualified distribution from your IRA to HACC or any qualified charity.

The qualified distribution amount will lower your adjusted gross income, thereby reducing the amount of federal income tax you pay. To qualify, the distribution must be made directly from your IRA to HACC. You don't need to itemize taxes in order to make an IRA charitable distribution. However, if you do itemize your tax deductions, you may not also claim a charitable tax deduction when making a charitable distribution from your IRA. Because you are giving directly from your IRA, your Adjusted Gross Income is reduced, which may reduce the amount of your Social Security and other income that are taxed.
