

PROGRAM HIGHLIGTS

CLOTHING BANK Appointments are no longer necessary at this time. A mask is optional but we ask that you use hand sanitizer and please continue to obey social distancing rules while you shop.

Our clothing Bank is open to the public. Come and shop Monday—Thursday from 9 am to 12 pm . We have all styles and sizes of gently used clothing for all sizes.(newborns, children, women, & men) We also have small housewares and linens

Clothing is free, although monetary donations are appreciated. Other items are priced accordingly.

The clothing bank will also have hours every 2nd Saturday of the month.



CHANGING LIVES SHELTER

The Changing Lives Shelter remains on a limited capacity, with the following guidelines in place:

The Shelter operates 22-hours a day, 7-days a week and closes each day between 11AM to 1PM.

Potential residents must have lived in the Greater Hanover Area for at least four to six months and go through our intake process to determine if they are eligible to stay.

Due to Covid-19, the Shelter has the capacity to hold six men, six woman on a one-person per room basis, and two families.

Residents are subjected to mandatory random drug and alcohol testing.

Volunteers are currently needed in the Shelter one day a week from 7AM to 11AM.

PROVIDE A LUNCH

Lunch is served daily from 11:30 AM—12:30 PM. It is still on a carryout basis. You may come to the back entrance during those times to pick up a bagged lunch. The dining hall is still not open to the public.




