


'And she brought forth her first born son, and wrapped Him in swaddling clothes, and laid Him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn.' Luke 2:7

That was before Frank had a conversation with a neighbor friend, John Nickey about his boredom when suddenly John said: "Mr. Frank, I have the perfect solution to your dilemma!" And with that, Frank applied for the volunteer position as Director of the P.A.L. Program at the Hanover Area Council of Churches. Any time this couple can work together they are happy, so, Hazel joined him and served in many ways. This was the beginning of a time of service, satisfaction and fulfillment under the leadership of Ms. Carol Hinkle whom they will always cherish.

Pastor Kate said something to the effect she needed someone to lead the effort. Hazel will always be ready to serve if someone would ask but that night her hand went straight up, and she almost screamed: "I'LL DO IT!". It had been a long time since she was that excited, about anything except her grandchildren. She told me later that seemed to be the perfect opportunity to give back to the children. If she could not teach, this was another way to work for the children.

Before we could spell HELP, two unbelievable ladies, Claudia Hudson and Deb Seibert volunteered to help as co-coordinators. That threesome along with teams from several area churches created a magnificent mission within the Hanover Community. In the beginning Ruth's Harvest served about fifty children from all three schools. Soon the word became known, and the numbers grew. Within 2 years, the Ruth's Harvest Ministry was serving 200 PLUS families every week. They were receiving food and monetary donations from many area businesses, private donations, and several congregations even provided "DROP BOXES" within church building.





In 2015, Frank and Hazel were surprised and humbled when they were honored with the ROBERT J. SMITH GOLDEN DEEDS AWARD for their work with the Hanover Area Council of Churches—Ruth's Harvest, the TOUCH OF LIFE PROGRAM, as well as their efforts in organizing a GRIEF ENCOUNTER GROUP for the area. The school year 2021-22 began on time with Claudia and Deb as leaders with some of the church teams from the 2019-20 school year. We are hoping more volunteers will form additional teams to pack and deliver the meals each week. We pray you will continue to support this vital school ministry with your food and monetary gifts!

Frank is back to good health because of your prayers, the loving care of Hazel, and he is excited to return to working with Ruth's Harvest. Hazel was doing a superb job of returning to good health when she raised the bedroom window about four weeks ago when she suffered five compressed discs and is now awaiting for surgery. Frank is asking for prayers so one day they can continue the work together outside the home as they do at home.

Nine-year-old Caleb Harner has always cared deeply about the homeless, frequently expressing his concern about them getting enough to eat and having a warm place to sleep. According to his mother, "Caleb has a big heart and passion for taking care of people. He has always been aware of others and concerned when he sees them in need. He will put the needs of others first and do what he can to help them."

After Caleb toured the Changing Lives Homeless Shelter on Carlisle Street recently with his family, Caleb decided to take on a special project this holiday season. He is attempting to raise enough funds to purchase 35 new industrial mattresses for the shelter (approximately \$5000) and to provide 35 new twin size sheet sets and blankets. Caleb stated that his Christmas wish this year is "For all the homeless people to stay warm and sleep in a comfortable place."

To help make Caleb's wish come true, monetary donations should be made payable to the Hanover Area Council of Churches, with the memo noting Caleb's Heart for the Homeless, and mailed to HACC at 136 Carlisle Street, Hanover. 

Faith at Work

We will be forever grateful for their hard work and contributions to our community. With love—HACC Staff

Faith at Work ministry was started at some point prior to 1986 by Betty Coney. The group originally met in an upstairs room in the Hanover Council building, but parking, stairs and room size became an issue. Betty got permission to move the group to Grace United Methodist Church on Albright Drive. There was a large room and closet available and ample parking and no stairs (most members were older). I do know that a one time they did sew at their meetings and they made bed pads for cancer patients.

I joined the group in 2009 after I retired, at that time we were cutting out bibs, burp cloths and blankets for Tender Care Pregnancy. We also cut adult bibs, comfort bags, water bottle bags, walker bags and lap robes that were taken to Lebanon Valley VA hospital. There were little gowns, hats and blankets made and donated to local hospitals for bereavement of parents with infant/stillborn loss.

By this time, Betty had arranged with a homebound member of Grace church to do all the sewing of the cut items. They were picked up, sewn and returned.

The sewing machines the group used were donated to Mission Central. They refurbish and do any needed repairs, then send the machines overseas, underprivileged families could actually eke out a living with these machines.

Over the years as Betty had to give up driving, she would ask me to purchase needed materials for the group. With her arthritis and age, Betty handed the ministry over to me.

We continued making items for Tender Care and the VA hospital....then Covid hit in 2020 and everything was shut down including churches and the organizations were not allowed to accept donated items. Finally, in the late Spring of 2021, we were able to resume the ministry. A van was filled with items and transported to the Lebanon Valley VA only to be told that they would accept nothing accept the lap robes, there was no interest in the other items.

We then checked with Tender Care and found that their bins are full and no one was coming in or calling for items. We did research local nursing and assisted living facilities, but their needs were minimal.

Grace church has done a mission trip to Red Bird Mission in Kentucky coal mining region in Appalachia. We packed up all remaining items for adults and babies and they were taken to Kentucky in October. We do have a box of baby and children's blankets that will be donated to the Linus Project. I explored and found a ministry called "Sweet Grace Ministries" that serves many hospitals in PA with bereavement support for parents with pregnancy related loss. They were glad to receive 2 totes of tiny gowns, hats and blankets.

We figure the ministry had at least a 25 year very productive run and just like many other things were found to be needed because of the Covid pandemic. About 2 weeks before Betty Coney's passing, I was able to speak with her by phone and make her aware that the program was ending, she was OK with that and commented "we had a good run".

Two Ways of Giving



Future Gift

We often think of giving in terms of current income. However, many people have accumulated assets and/or resources other than current cash or bank accounts. Probably most have more value in stocks, bonds, IRA's, retirement plans, life insurance, real estate, etc. than in current income. One way of helping the Hanover Council of Churches (HACC) is to leave a gift through one or more of the above resources. In this way you can provide for HACC's future to continue ministering to those in need.

The most common way of designating a future gift is to include language in your will, trust, beneficiary form, estate plan, etc., that leaves a specific amount or a % (percentage) of your assets.

Sample wording could include: I give a ____ % of, or the sum of \$_____ from my estate, account, beneficiary form, etc., to the Hanover Area Council of Churches P.O. Box 1561, 136 Carlisle St. Hanover, PA 17331 and Tax ID#23-2354101

Current Gift

One way of maximizing current giving is to give from appreciated stock that you have owned for more than one year because you can claim the current value rather than the original cost. If you transfer the stock directly to HACC, you avoid paying capital gains tax. In addition, if you itemize on your federal tax return, you get the benefit of deducting the appreciated value of the stock and avoiding having to pay tax on the capital gains.




