Dear Friends of Hanover Area Council of Churches,

It is an honor and privilege to have been named the Executive Director of the Hanover Area Council of Churches. I would like to take this opportunity to introduce myself.



Last PAL serving of 2021! This year, we felt that PAL clients needed warm gifts. In the past, we have given food gifts with cookies, fruits, and other snack foods. Last year, we gave personal kits. Winter can be a long season, especially when you don't have a warm car to take you places but must instead rely on walking. Missy Anstine, Jeanne Baugher, and Dorette Garrett assembled the warm gift kits—84 adult and 10 child kits. Each plastic bag contained a ski hat, heavy duty socks, and warm gloves. One of the programs that HACC supports is PAL (Provide-a-Lunch) in which volunteer churches prepare and serve a hot meal at 11:30 am. This important ministry serves anyone in the Hanover area; just show up at the door at lunchtime & receive a hot meal. Since the pandemic began in March 2020, all PAL meals have been grab 'n go. That means all food must be placed in a styrofoam clamshell in a plastic bag with eating utensils, a fruit, a snack, and a water bottle.
