CHANGING *Lives* HOMELESS SHELTER



TRANSFORMING LIVES

This is the third in a series of personal stories of our homeless shelter residents.

Glenn S. was raised by his grandmother in York, PA. After going to York Vo-Tech for carpentry, he worked at Weis Markets for a few years. Glenn got married and had a son Wesley, who is now 14. He worked at Lamar Advertising for ten years putting up billboards, sometimes working 105-150 feet off the ground. He divorced in 2013.

Glenn was diagnosed with colon cancer, which was caught early, and declared cancer free in 2016. He worked at various jobs, married again in 2017, and lived in Glen Rock and Shrewsbury. They had a son Aubrey, who is now 4 years old. When his wife decided to leave the marriage, Glenn moved to Delaware to help his mother suffering from Stage IV COPD.

In February 2022, Glenn returned to the area, hoping to revive his marriage. When that did not work out, he needed to find a job and a place to stay in Hanover. Glenn came to the Changing Lives Shelter, quickly got a job, and started saving money for an apartment. He is currently a loader at Utz Foods, and just moved to his own apartment on April 8 and volunteers at PAL on the weekends!

Glenn stated that "If it were not for the shelter, I don't know where I'd be. Everyone here is awesome. When I first came, I was scared and felt alone, but I made some good friends here. It's a good place to come to recover. If you get motivated and stay positive, things will work out." Thank you for sharing your story Glenn. God bless you! We wish you continued success!

Our desire is to serve the community, and what better way than to combine our abilities and work together to cook a meal for those in need. Harvest Chapel cooks a meal every 4th Wednesday. We usually have a team of 6 to 12 people, all ages. We're told that one of the most requested favorites is our BBQ chicken. We've cooked lasagna, white chicken chili, jumbalaya and chicken alfredo, just to name a few. We enjoy cooking meals that we would like to have in our own homes with sauces made from scratch.

Part of our time at PAL lunch includes a time for reading the Bible, discussion, and praying for all of those who will receive a meal, and their families. It is a joy-filled, wonderful time of fellowship and service. We pray for the meal with the recipients and offer individualized private prayer as well. We enjoy talking with and loving on the individuals as we are able.

We thoroughly enjoy working with the team at PAL lunch. Joan makes sure that we have all the ingredients that we need to prepare our meals. The ladies that organize Meals On Wheels also help us to package the food for the shelter and community. This is a true testimony of "Many hands, light work." CRISIS FUND SUCCESS

Because of your generous support, Hanover Area Council of Churches (HACC) was able to surpass our goal of \$300,000. In 2019, HACC received word that we would lose the \$100,000 a year from a grant we were receiving. At that time HACC established a Crisis Fund with a goal of \$100,000 a year for 3 years to give us some breathing room to replace the \$100,000. That three-year period ends December 31, 2022. Thank you for your contributions which total \$313,490.33 as of May 17, 2022.

We are still in the process of securing ways to replace the yearly \$100,000 a year. That challenge along with the need to do some building updates creates an ongoing need for investments to continue providing important life saving ministries including:

the only year round 24 hour shelter in Hanover,

PAL lunch 365 days a year,

Meals on Wheels 5 days a week to shut ins and disabled persons,

Ruth’s Harvest (weekend back packs of food for elementary students during the school year).

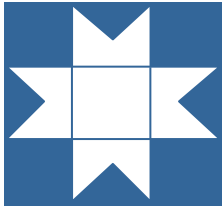
