## FROM THE FUND DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

### A Unique Way to Support The Hanover Area Council of Churches

If you are 70 1/2 you are typically required to withdraw money (known as a Required Minimum Distribution or RMD) from your traditional IRA account(s) and pay income tax on the withdrawal amount. However there is a way to avoid income tax on some withdrawals from your IRA accounts. Retirees ages 70 1/2 and older who transfer any amount up to \$100,000 directly from their IRA to a qualified charity such as HACC will not owe income tax on the contribution. A charitable distribution from your IRA can be used to satisfy your required minimum distribution and in turn does other good things such as lowering your adjusted gross income which might make less of your Social Security taxable.

A nontaxable charitable distribution must be made directly from the trustee of your IRA to HACC. If you withdraw the money yourself and then donate it to HACC you will need to pay income tax on the distribution. However part or all of your RMD up to \$100,000 can be transferred federal income tax free to HACC by the trustee of your account. The amount transferred can usually be a one time payment or periodically (monthly or quarterly), according to the guidelines of your trustee. For example if you donate \$5,000 from your IRA directly to HACC and you are in the 20 percent tax bracket, you will avoid \$1,000 in taxes. But even a smaller \$500 contribution would reduce your tax bill by \$100.

## OUR COMMUNITY SUPPORT



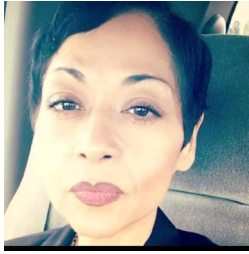
McSherrystown Moose Lodge has teamed up with our PAL program and we've received an amazing donation. 1000 food containers have been donated to serve our community.

Since April 17, 2020 (during COVID shutdown), Trinity started to provide a pizza party every Friday night for the people who are in the Changing Lives Shelter. Every Friday night (We haven't missed one yet!) someone from Trinity picks up the pizzas and delivers them to the door of the shelter between 5:15 and 5:30 along with a couple gallons of lemonade and iced tea. Trinity credits Lorene Crooks for this wonderful project. She takes care of ordering and most of the delivering. The congregation supports this project by donating money and helping Lorene with pickup/delivery. Trinity also contributes to the HACC Shelter by buying frozen food items to help with their evening meals at the shelter.

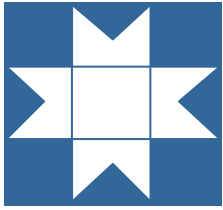
