FROM THE FUND DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

HACC is a bustling place! Every day groups serve hot PAL lunches to about 120 people. Weekdays hot Meals on Wheels are delivered to about 30 individuals. During the school year, a backpack of food is provided every weekend to qualifying elementary school children to take home for the weekend. The shelter is open every day and provides a much-needed safe place to stay, food, and clothing. The Clothing Bank has been renovated and serves our clients as well as hundreds of people from the community!

The Council of Churches serves great needs in Hanover and every person is important. Every person is cared for, loved, fed, and given a place.

The past several years have been very challenging for all of us and that includes HACC. Old ways of doing things have changed dramatically and the new creates adjustments and challenges. We have experienced a growth in the number of people being served. Like most nonprofits, HACC has seen a decrease in the number of volunteers and has been compelled to create more paid positions. In addition to retain and attract staff, we have had to increase the amount we pay staff. We have an older building and have been told that we have needs to bring our facility up to current standards.

P.S. If you are 72 and you need to make a Required Minimum Distribution from your IRA account, you can make a nontaxable distribution for any amount up to \$100,000 to a qualified charity such as HACC and will not owe federal tax on the amount of the contribution. This nontaxable charitable distribution must be made from the trustee of your IRA to HACC. TAX SEASON IS COMING UP!

The AARP Foundation Tax-Aide Program is again offering FREE tax service for York County taxpayers during the 2023 tax season, especially adults 50 and older with low or moderate income. AARP Tax-Aide volunteers can prepare most personal income tax returns, including those with basic self-employment income. They are not trained to do business returns such as corporate, partnership, limited partnership, farm income, or rental income. These types of returns are beyond the scope of the Tax-Aid program.

There is no fee and AARP membership is not required.

Taxpayers should bring their photo ID and proof of their social security number or ITIN numbers for anyone on the tax return, including children or other claimed dependents. Also, last year's tax return is helpful if available.

Beginning mid-January 2023, you can make an appointment by calling the Hanover Area Council of Churches at 717-633-6353. After making an appointment, taxpayers are asked to pick up and complete an Intake Form before coming for your appointment. Packets can be picked up at Hanover Church of the Brethren on Monday mornings between 9 and 12 noon beginning January 23, or at the Hanover Area Council of Churches. JJ'S TOY SHOP 2022






