# MINISTRY SPOTLIGHT

2013 Ruth's Harvest started in September, serving Hanover Elementary

40,000 meals served in 1st year

2014 Program expanded to all Hanover Public SD Elementary schools

Average number of backpacks distributed each Friday - January through April 2024



For we are coworkers in God's service; you are God's field, God's building.

The name **RUTH'S HARVEST** comes from the Second Chapter of the book of RUTH. During biblical times, when harvesting their crop, farmers would begin the harvest 3 or 4 rows in from the ends of the crop, thus leaving the first few rows for the less fortunate. Ruth made a point of gathering the crop to distribute to her neighbors. The concept of that day is demonstrated through this ministry.





Donated items, including goods purchased from monetary donations, are delivered to Ruth's Harvest.



Everything is sorted onto shelves and into bins for easy distribution on packing day!





On packing day, bins are placed in order for simple assembly. Each backpack meal kit is bagged and ready for delivery to the schools.

# **SPECIAL FEATURE:** *Family of Hope*

When you donate to the Changing Lives Shelter, you greatly impact and bless the lives of many residents going through struggles and challenging times. Each resident who comes to us has a story. Some come to the shelter because of health reasons, others due to job loss or divorce. With their permission, here is the story of one family, "Hope" currently in our shelter with their three children.

"Hope" was one of six children whose biological parents struggled with alcohol and drug addiction. Placed in various foster homes, then split from siblings, "Hope" was sexually assaulted as a child. "Hope" was adopted and attended 4 different high schools. At age 18, they moved to Virginia to try to rekindle a relationship with their biological mother, which proved unsuccessful. In 2014, "Hope" met their spouse in Virginia, where they both lived and worked and had their first child a year later. They married in 2017 but moved to Pennsylvania in 2018 when one spouse lost their job after neck surgery and the other spouse suffered a vehicle accident with traumatic brain injury. They stayed with family for a short time, but then became homeless, living in their car for over a year. They entered a shelter, where they lived for six months until they were able to get their own place. Soon after they welcomed their second child.

In 2022, they moved back to Virginia and stayed with family until the beginning of 2024. After their third child was born in 2023, one parent lost their job due to post-partum depression and mental health issues. The other spouse worked two jobs until experiencing personal trauma at work, causing depression and eventual drug addiction. They went through rehabilitation and is currently in Virginia staying with friends with the goal of joining the family when their situation becomes stable. They video chat and text daily.

"Hope" came to the Changing Lives Shelter with their three children in June 2024. Without transportation since their car's engine blew, they walked 2 1/2 miles to attend the PAL lunch after visiting the public library. At PAL lunch, "Hope" heard that HACC also offered a shelter. They applied for the shelter and was contacted the next day by Erika Gonzalez, Shelter Coordinator, to move into the family room, which has a bedroom and living room area. In the shelter, the family was given a safe place to live, plus food, toys, clothing, laundry care, personal hygiene supplies, diapers, wipes, help enrolling the oldest child in school, and counseling services to assist in finding a job and an apartment. "Hope" states that the shelter is a peaceful, healing place that gives them stability, a routine, and schedule. It also gives them an address, which is invaluable when trying to get a job, license, or benefits. "Hope" believes that God is working miracles in their family's lives. They have started to pray more and they are attending a local church. "Hope" will attend classes starting in August to obtain a CDL license. "Hope" states the family has gone through a lot and has struggled, but it is getting better.

In addition to needing a job, "Hope" stated that they need transportation and a stroller wagon for the two youngest children, as their double stroller has a hole in the middle.



# HACC VOLUNTEERING

## A guide to obtaining Volunteer clearances



### 01 - Volunteer Application

Our Volunteer Form can be found on our website: <u>www.hanoverareacouncilofchurches.org</u> First CLICK on a ministry, then CLICK on "Volunteer" to access our Volunteer Application. Print and fill out the form for return with the required volunteer clearances. This should occur BEFORE arriving to volunteer at Hanover Area Council of Churches.





## 02- Child Abuse History Certification

This clearance is CY113 and is FREE for Volunteers. Visit <u>www.pa.gov</u> and type "CY113" in the search bar at the top right of the screen. You can continue online by making an account, or print the form for submission by postal mail. Be sure to indicate **VOLUNTEER.** Also please note you will need to list ALL persons who you have lived with since 1975, as well as all addresses where you have lived since 1975.



### 03- PA State Police Criminal History

This is another required and FREE clearance for Volunteers. Still on <u>www.pa.gov</u> search for "SP4-164A" or ePATCH. If you want a paper form to submit via mail, search for "SP4-164A.pdf" to get the online printable Volunteer form.



#### 04 - Volunteer!

Once your HACC General Volunteer Application plus two Volunteer-level clearances have been received at HACC, you will be contacted by a ministry coordinator to begin volunteering!
